Active Transportation Infrastructure Investment Program (ATIIP)

Summary: This program provides competitive grant funds for 1) planning and design or 2) construction of projects that provide safe and connected active transportation infrastructure in an active transportation network or active transportation spine. An active transportation network can include a sidewalk network, bike lane network, or shared use path network within a community and must connect between destinations within a community or metropolitan region, (such as connecting neighborhoods and residences to high-demand destinations like schools, workplaces, commercial centers, recreation areas, medical centers, or other community areas). An active transportation spine can include a rail trail or rail-with-trail, walking path, or bike route and must connect two or more communities, metropolitan regions, or States.

Examples of Eligible Activities:

Planning and Design Grants

- Public engagement activities
- Design and planning studies that support the development of a construction project
- Conceptual and preliminary engineering plans tied to projects in an approved transportation plan
- Other related transportation planning activities for active transportation networks or spines

Construction Grants

- Property acquisition
- Site preparation, demolition, or development
- Studies, surveys, plans, permits, insurance, interest, financing, tax and assessments
- Construction, rehabilitation, reconstruction
- Land improvements

Eligible Applicants: Local or regional organizations, multi-county special districts, States, multi-state groups of governments, and Tribes.

Match & Maximum Grant Awards: A 20 percent match is required unless the project/planning activity is serving a disadvantaged community with poverty rate over 40 percent.

Planning and Design grants are expected to range between \$100,000 and \$2 million. Construction grants must have total project costs of at least \$15 million with a grant award minimum of \$7.5 million.

Deadline: Applications must be submitted by June 17, 2024.
